Dear friends,

November is a time when we pause to remember the ultimate sacrifice paid by millions of people in the two World Wars and other conflicts. Estimates suggest between 15 to 22 million died in the First World War and over 60 million in the Second World War. The cost and sacrifice of war is incalculable, and it is only right and proper that we never forget all those who died in war.

From my study window in the Manse, I have a direct view over the Cenotaph, situated at the top of the Mall. The red poppy wreaths provide a flash of red amidst the mundane colours of the surrounding buildings. I walk and drive past the Cenotaph every day and it is a daily reminder, in the busyness of one's day, that millions sacrificed their lives for our liberty and peace.

At the very heart of the Christian faith is the cross - a universally recognised symbol. On the cross, Jesus Christ, 'bore our sins on his body'. (I Peter 2:24). Jesus paid the ultimate sacrifice too, not to bring political peace, but so we could know peace with God (Romans 5:1).

Peace is a very precious gift. Millions are still living under the shadow of war and conflict and are crying out for justice and peace. Through the sacrifice of Jesus Christ on our behalf, we can know peace with God. There is no greater blessing than this.
